# **Evangelism in Europe**

When Paul and his friends came to Europe on their travels, as described in the book of the Acts the Apostles, he started a tradition of evangelism which has lasted until today. The needs in Europe today are just as great as they were in Paul's day. There are small teams belonging to differing organisations scattered around Europe doing church planting, individual and community outreach and various practical ministries, like drug rehabilitation, clothes distributions, feeding programmes and sundry other practical things. The main difficulty which is encountered is not persecution or opposition but Sophisticated Europeans do not see the need of salvation or else they adhere to some other religion. If Europe is to be rewon for Christ there needs to be a deep work of the Spirit in many lives.

The church in Europe has long looked further afield to do its overseas outreach, but the needs of Europe are as great as any to be found in Africa or Asia. In many parts of the world Europe is seen as a heathen place in church circles, whereas it is seen as a 'Christian' place in a broader stereotype in the wider society. The differing perceptions about the spiritual status in Europe lead to mixed messages about the need to support evangelism and other outreach programmes. The only certain thing about Europe today is that there is a battle going on for the souls of the people in every corner of the continent.

The need to pray for the evangelisation of Europe has never been greater. The needs at home in Britain can be mirrored in every country of Europe bar none. There are prosperous churches, poverty and an apathetic majority in every country. The needs of communities are myriad and not every state is set up to meet such needs. For centuries the church in all its forms has sought to meet the needs of the people of Europe and today the need is as great as ever. Please pray for the needs of Europe and the efforts being made by indigenous and overseas workers to bring the gospel message to the people of Europe.
