THOUGHT OF THE MONTH

Every story has to start somewhere and at some time. Some stories take a few seconds or minutes to happen, like a car crash, and take ages to tell afterwards. Other stories take longer to happen and can be told relatively quickly. A tsunami hits Japan and eighteen months later the debris starts to wash up on the west coast of America. Some stories can become favourites and be retold over and over again, like Icelandic sagas, others do not have any interest beyond a few days of the event to which they refer. The best stories are written down so that many people can hear them over and over.

The Christmas story is an example of a story that is retold over and over again, generation after generation. What makes a story worth retelling once the players and events have passed into history? Could it be that the story portrays values which can make life better today, like romantic heroes of old, deeds of kindness and daring-do or generous gifts? Stories can also serve as warnings of how not to behave and the possible consequences for those who follow suit.

The Nativity story fits lots of these categories, a generous gift from God to the world of Jesus, heroic deeds by Joseph and Mary fleeing Herod's persecution and an arduous trek by the Wise Men to deliver their gifts. Whatever the merits of the story please enjoy the retelling again of the tale of Christmas; and remember to pray for those who may not be as fortunate as you are this festive season.
