Money is a subject which raises much passion in those who have it and much longing for those who do not. The Bible has much to say about attitudes towards money, both in the Old and New Testaments. The standard in the Old Testament was the tithe, and in the New Testament Jesus confirmed much the same teaching.

In recent years Tabs has enjoyed something of a blessing in financial terms, having balanced or surplus budgets at the end of each year. In 2014 the forecast is for a balanced budget with cuts to many areas of spending. When praying this month give thanks to God for the full provision in the past, and ask for guidance about what each person should do in regard to contributing in the future. Friday 21st

Please pray for someone only you can know about today. Ask God to bless them in whatever way is appropriate.

Saturday 22nd

Today you could pray for someone who you have never prayed for before. Think of a neighbour, person at work, college or school. The chances are you can quickly think of an individual or family you have yet to pray for, their welfare, spiritual growth and walk towards God.
