THOUGHT OF THE MONTH

Have you ever been on one of those homeless support sleep out events, or spent a night huddled in a make shift shelter down a back alley somewhere, or taken part in a 'Slum Survivor' type publicity stunt? All these designed to point to the fate of many people in the world who live in abject poverty. Jesus promised that there would always be poor people: 'The poor you will always have with you, but you will not always have me', (Matthew 26:11). The political economists would have us believe that poverty can be removed by humanitarian means, but history shows this to be bunk. New wealth in the developing world is hoarded by the elite instead of being shared by all. In the developed world social security systems rob people of the incentive to enterprise and look to better themselves, so poverty continues. In almost every political system in the world the status quo remains, and the poor remain at the bottom of the economic heap.

Jesus told His disciples to feed the poor and hungry, help the oppressed and deal in social justice. Please pray this month for people who seek to change the status quo in favour of the poor, the hungry and sick. Pray for honesty in governments who tax the rich, to make sure the poor benefit. Pray for aid agencies who promote self help schemes to help people be self supporting. Ask God to bless those who work on long term developments like hydroelectric infrastructure, irrigation schemes and other self help projects. Pray for a project with which you have an affinity.
