THOUGHT OF THE MONTH

Ask any business student what is the most tedious and dull subject which they have to study, and Organisations or Statistics would both be at the top of the list. Both of these subjects deal with generalisations and 'on average' type data. When you watch science programmes on TV the level of detail is often skimmed over for the dramatic shot of the presenter doing some outrageous stunt. Getting down to detail involves work, detailed planning of data gathering, analysis and inference of conclusions. Once the conclusions formulated a theory about the subject under investigation can be dreamed up and further experiments designed. When getting close and personal with God there are two levels to the process. One is like the 'average data subjects' or TV science, you skim the surface and then consider yourself an expert. The second is to take a little more care, do some research, read around the prayer topic, compare notes with others. (Scientists call this 'peer review', a most important stage in the Scientific Method). The resultant prayer is better informed, more targeted into the enemy's territory, more powerful in effect and more likely to result in being in the Will of God, hence more likely to be effective in the long term. Try a 'more effective prayer today'; you will be amazed at the results.
