THOUGHT OF THE MONTH

The rituals surrounding the end of life vary from place to place, time to time and culture to culture. In some cultures burial has to be done within a day of death. In ancient cultures there were months of processing to create a mummy as in Egypt. In modern British culture the lack of burial space promotes a culture which uses cremation as a method of hygienic disposal of human remains. In mediaeval times the church kept dug up bones in church crypts in the belief that they would be needed by their owners in the resurrection to eternal life. This belief is based on the book of Revelation, and the vision it paints of the dead rising to meet God. Such ideas seem to hold little credence amongst modern Christians, yet the church professes to believe the bible in every respect. The funeral acts as a channel for the living to say 'goodbye' to those who have passed away, and in some circles is used to proclaim the gospel at the same time. When praying this month please give thought to those for whom Christmas may not have been so merry, due to bereavements and the anniversaries of deaths happening around Christmas. Pray for those who have lost loved ones recently, those in hospices and those who are facing the prospect of soon being face to face with God for real. Please ask God to comfort those relatives who are sad, and ask Him to grant them His comfort and peace.
