THOUGHT OF THE MONTH Razzmatazz

There is a word used to describe the embellishments added to policy proposals by politicians and their spokesmen: spin. To people of a certain generation "spin" was what you did to a top or a cricket ball. Today the word has acquired an additional meaning of adding hype and glitter to things, usually to make them look better. One of the ways desperate people can get into difficulty is by believing the spin of the traffickers about a better life elsewhere. "The grass is always greener on the other side of the hill" just about sums up that situation, and vulnerable people can be taken in. In the Bible the promises made by God to various people sometimes seemed never to happen. When Moses was called to lead Israel out of Egypt the promises God made to him were all kept, despite the apparent spin about 'great works' needed to impress Pharaoh and his court. Jesus made many promises in the New Testament about many things. How do you rate the promises of God for today? Does the promise, for example, never to leave or forsake His children seem like spin, or can you believe it for your own life? Jesus promised to send His spirit to indwell all who would believe in Him. Does that sound like spin or something to desire and ask God to enable in your life? Christians have been praying that God would lead them in His promises for generations, many can testify to His faithfulness. When praying this month ask God to show you His promises for your life.
