### **THOUGHT OF THE MONTH**

#### Technology

Today "technology" is a word over used by the media, writers and just about everyone to describe a process, a method of work or way of doing things. Technology used in some places can seem backwards and primitive to someone used to a more advanced environment. To Western eyes water in the tap is normal and no one takes any notice of the infrastructure behind it. To people in developing countries where the norm is to go and draw water from a well or spring it is a marvel when it comes to their village. Does not having the latest tech bother you? For some people it is essential to have the latest gizmo, gadget, phone, computer or whatever. In some ways this reflects the "keeping up with the Joneses" mentality which pervades modern society. Other people struggle to cope with technological advances, while others reject such new fangled notions. In past times there was just as much pressure to keep up to date as there is today. A weapon made from iron was much better than a bronze knife, a machine run by water power could do more than a horse. Power from a steam engine was much more efficient than a water wheel. When Jesus taught His disciples to pray there was no need for technology, all they needed was a penitent heart and time to listen to God. Today the same applies; the minister may use a tablet to preach from instead of a sheaf of papers, but the message is still the same: "seek me and I will answer your prayer". When praying this month ask God to show you how to use technology in the work of His kingdom.
