Thought for the Month

Getting a good deal is something which everyone wants, whether buying bananas or a car. When you embark upon such a transaction you immediately suspect the salesman of trying to hoodwink you. The bananas may be going off or the car might be a 'ringer', (one rebuilt after a crash write off). Everyone likes to think they can spot a rogue when they see one and so avoid getting done over for some dodgy product. Why then do people leave their brains in bed when confronted by the message of the gospel? Examination of the claims of Jesus must lead to one of two conclusions, either He was a very good conman or else He was who He claimed to be. Some people deny that Jesus ever existed, but that is a different story. The disciples all bore testimony in Acts 2 that they had seen the risen Jesus. Millions of Christians have followed Jesus down the centuries. Today you do not have to look very hard to find people have been persecuted. murdered or displaced for sticking to faith in Jesus at all cost. On the other hand the prejudiced views about Jesus which have no basis in faith can be seen as attacks of the Devil.

Shining the light of reason on faith can be a frustrating exercise. Understanding why people choose to be Christians or not is equally frustrating. Praying for guidance in the face of unbelief or outright hostility is something every Christian will need to come to terms with sooner or later. Jesus faced hostility when going to Jerusalem for the last time, why should it be different for His followers? Ask God to give you guidance in praying this month, about why you believe in Jesus.
