Thought for the Month

"History is bunk" is a phrase attributed to Henry Ford who founded the Ford Motor Company in USA. There are lots of programmes on the TV that explore all sorts of aspects of history, from tales of huge wars and battles to families and individuals. Everyone is effected by history whether they like it or not. If you were born in Iraq the history of the Middle East, the fall of the Ottoman Empire and the British mandate in Iraq in the 1920s & 30s all indirectly impact on your life. If you were born in Wales the chances are very high that two or three generations back someone in your family tree came from England to work in a coal mine, resulting from the discovery of coal in South Wales. All these are examples of history influencing the material circumstances of families and how they live their lives. The Iraqi family could now be in a refugee camp, with no prospects. The Welsh family could have good jobs, economic prosperity and a good life.

The way the history of the church is presented, the historical theology espoused by a church, the ongoing ministries within a church all effect the choices available to those who follow on in the wake of preceding generations. Trying to change the ideas and culture in a country, organisation, family or group can be an uphill struggle. Turning around the fortunes of a failing business, school, organisation or family needs a radical approach, which changes the culture from one of fatalistic acceptance to a dynamic which reaches out to achieve new goals and targets. In God's economy this starts with prayer, setting aside old ideas, programmes and ways of doing things, and looking for God to lead to new thinking, methods, and opportunities. This month ask God to show can lead you things which opportunities, outreach possibilities, moving you and the church on to new victories in Jesus, new converts, better programmes and greater outputs in the Kingdom of Heaven.
