Thought for the Month

One of the defining things about "British Values" is the love of a nice cup of tea. The fact that this custom was taken from China to India by the British and then back home is of no great consequence. The ritual of 'afternoon tea' was a defining cultural event in millions of homes for decades. Today there are rival beverages to tea, like coffee, most of which were imported from somewhere else. In any civilised society there are actions which are prohibited: murder, theft, violence against the person and the like. Each society has differing emphasis on different behaviours. In some places wandering around semi naked is ok, in other places everyone has to be covered up all over. So relating to God in different parts of the world has different emphases. Some places have 'bell, book and candle', smells, chants and singing, while in others there are plain rooms, no altars or images, or even doors and windows. God is big enough and large enough to cope with the whole spectrum of churches, worship styles, formal or informal and all places in between. Do you have a small or large mental image of God? Is your idea of God something you invented, something you picked up from someone else, something you acquired in your travels or something along the lines of Jesus as in the Bible? Whatever the values you espouse, whether foreign or home grown, there is only one thing for certain: God loves you, and particularly when you pray. This month ask God to show you the values He wants you to have, there is much about this subject in the New Testament under "gifts of the Spirit". Ask God to open your heart to His leading on your values.

At Christmas last year, UK consumer spending hit a massive £80 billion for the festive season: excess spending for Easter weekend was £747 million. If our money really shows us where our heart is, then it would seem that we think that Christmas is 9 times more important than Easter!

In fact, whilst the early church celebrated Easter from the earliest days, Christmas was not added to the Christian calendar in Britain until the 6th century. In 1644 Parliament banned Christmas as an unimportant, pagan festival! Easter has always been more important.

Easter is actually the most important celebration in the Christian calendar. The celebrations of Palm Sunday; the inauguration of the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday; the sacrifice of Good Friday and the celebrations of Easter Sunday are the most important festivals in our liturgical year and as Christians we need to remember their importance.

So let me ask you: how important is Easter to you? How seriously have you taken preparations through Lent and how joyously do you intend to celebrate this year.
