Are you one of those people who refuse to 'do' technology? Do you still want everything to be as it used to be, no change in the familiar things as they have 'always' been? Or on the other hand are you one of those much maligned people whose life revolves around 'tech'? Do you always have your nose glued to a smart phone, use electronic devices to do everything, sit at a desk all day and never do exercise? Each of these attitudes can have an upside and a down side. If you refuse to use social media then you miss out on news of family and friends, find getting some services impossible, but you do miss all the advertising garbage as well. If you only pay attention to a screen then you miss out on human contact, and 'enjoy' all the advertising crud as well.

When it comes to information about places, people and situations which you may be interested in, then using electronic tech can have a large part to play, as well as the traditional paper routes. There are many places in the world where owning a bible for example is downright dangerous, but getting it on a mobile phone, which can be deleted if necessary, is a much safer option.
