Thought for the Month

Where is God?

How many funerals have you attended? Do you dread going to such events, or are you so used to going that it becomes just another day out? Saying "goodbye" is always a difficult thing to do. In the 18th & 19th centuries many Irish migrants left home to go to America or come to Wales. The families of such people very often never saw them again after they departed. In the Bible there are stories of long journeys made at the direction of God, where people were sent to do particular tasks. Samuel got sent all over the place to visit prophets, deliver blessings and warnings, as well as judge the disputes of the people of Israel. Very often life is portrayed as a journey, like in 'Pilgrim's Progress'. Psalm 23 speaks of journeying through a valley, a dark and dismal place described as: 'the Valley of the Shadow of Death'. In all these situations God is present. He never sent anyone somewhere without preparation, and setting up the players. When Jesus sent two disciples to collect a donkey, it was where it was supposed to be. One of the hardest lessons in the Christian life is to learn to be dependent upon God. Some people do this much better than others, so this month when praying ask God to show you how He looks after you. Can you see God at that funeral, at work, at home, in church, in the shop or when out with friends? Ask God to increase your perception of His leading in your life in your prayers.

The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases, His mercies never come to an end. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. Lamentations 3:22-23 (ESV)

It is easy to forget that every Sunday service is a celebration of the good news of the resurrection and the new beginning we have in Christ. Early Christians moved their day of worship to a Sunday (from the Sabbath/Saturday) to remind themselves that every Sunday is a resurrection day! Indeed, every new day can be a new beginning and a fresh start in Christ.
