Thought for the Month

Do you let other people make up your mind for you? Are you the sort of person who always needs to get your own way, do you get uptight when someone else steals the limelight? Or on the other hand are you one of those people who just 'go with the flow' and never make a stand about anything? In the group of people who were Jesus' disciples there were both sorts of people. Peter was the sort of bloke who wanted to be at the front of the queue for everything. Some of the others get few mentions in the gospels, and very often appear to just be along for the ride, to make up the numbers.

When it comes to thinking about what to pray for how do you decide what to give support to, and what to leave to someone else? Being able to think for yourself is one of those life skills which education is supposed to teach everyone. Sometimes it works and sometimes not. Making up your mind to follow Jesus is something which no one else can determine for you, however much they want you to or not as the case may be. Similarly learning to pray is a life skill which you can get taught the theory for, but which only comes together by experience and practise, like leaning to swim or ride a bike. When praying this month ask God to clearly show you the things to pray for, and the discernment to know what to leave on the table.

"Do this in Remembrance of me." (Luke 22:19)
