When God decided to communicate He did not turn to technology, instead He sent some angels to a few obscure people in a backwards province of the Roman Empire. From that man a worldwide movement grew up with the most revolutionary message which has ever been conceived in human history. # prayer diary: december 2017

"We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." (Romans 8:28)

A few days ago Claire was reading the works of Julian of Norwich for an essay she is writing. Julian is most well known for the quote, "All shall be well, and all shall be well and all manner of things shall be well". What is less well known is that this line is part of a prayer: the next bit is roughly, "So, God, why isn't everything well? Why isn't everything all right? If you love us and want the best for us, why is there sin and suffering in the world?"

You may remember how a year ago, just before Christmas, the Manse caught fire and we were made homeless. A few days later I deployed overseas with the army and left my family behind. It now appears that I may have damaged my lungs in the fire, and will have to live with the consequences of that. At the time the whole thing was awful, and it was easy to ask, "God, why is this happening? Where are you". However, twelve months on we can look back and see how God was journeying with us and caring for us through the bad times. The church was loving and generous. Steve Roberts and the maintenance hub worked hard to sort the house out, and members made sure we were provided for in all things. A year on, we can look back and say "all manner of things are well".

Christmas is the time when we celebrate that God became one of us in the flesh of Jesus. He lived and worked, suffered and died as one of us. There were times in his life when everything seemed to be going wrong. However, at the end of the Gospels we are able to look back and see how God was working good, even in the times of struggle and suffering. Believing that God is with us in difficult times requires faith: But Christmas is the reminder that Immanuel, God with us, is here even in those difficult times. One day, we will be able to look back and say, "Even when life was hard, I know that all was well and all manner of things were well. Because Immanuel was there."
