# Deception

Today modern society is plagued by deceptions of all kinds. There was a series of programmes on the television recently which majored on Elizabethan plots and the counter intelligence employed to foil them. Living in a world of fake news, half-truths, downright lies and fabricated stories is nothing new, just that now it gets more media exposure. How can you tell when you are being spun a yarn and when told the truth? The best test is experience. Does the source in question have a good reputation, are they historically reliable, do they have integrity? Everyone knows that the tabloid press historically made up the story to fit their spin profile, and continue to do so to this day. Some media channels are more reliable than others, but history can show who is usually correct.

When it comes to spiritual matters how much store can you set on any one particular church, denomination or individual? False religions and heretical sects abound today, so working out which one is true and which one deceptive is not always easy. Paul tells his readers that anyone who tells them a different message to that which he preached to them is incorrect. The bible tells readers to test prophecy to see if it accords with the will of God. So Christians need to divine truth from fiction when listening to God. The bible is God's manual for Christian living, doctrine and guidance, so using it to guide your prayer life must be a good way to avoid being deceived. Ask God to guide you in the truth as you pray this month.

This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. (1 John 4:10)

We don't really 'do' Valentine's Day in our house. Maybe we are just not very romantic, or maybe we have been married too long to get sentimental about it! But we do talk about love a lot, and almost never go to sleep without saying, "I love you" to one another.

Our human relationships are a shadow or a prophetic symbol of God's relationship with his people expressed through the bond between Christ and the 'bride of Christ', the church. That is why marriage is so important in the Bible - it points to deeper things. It is also why unfaithfulness, adultery or sex before marriage are such hot button topics for evangelical Christians! The long term, monogamous covenant relationship of marriage reflects the unchanging love of God. When we mess with that symbol in our relationships, the truth is not in us and we are saying untrue things about God's relationship with his church.

But the Bible tells us something special about the love of God. Whilst we were still far off and walking away from God, he loved us. In fact this is love: not that we loved God at all, but that he first loved us. Usually a couple fall in love and feel mutual love. We love God because he first loved us - even when we didn't deserve it.
