The Lord is Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. (2 Corinthians 3:17)

Scattered throughout the year are the great Christian festivals and celebrations: Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter, Ascension, Pentecost, and Harvest. The Church throughout history has celebrated these events and marked them with special traditions and services. However, the day after Pentecost, we entered 'Ordinary Time' in the liturgical calendar. Between now and December (with the exception of 'Trinity Sunday' in June) we worship and celebrate the ordinary, everyday life of the Christian.

The first time I went to Spring Harvest was in 1986. I had become a Christian the previous summer and joined a small, inner-city church. The vast gatherings and modern music of Spring Harvest was a revelation. However, I remember Graham Kendrick saying on the last day, "Don't go home and try to reproduce Spring Harvest in your home churches. You can't do it! This has been a special time of worship and celebration but most of your Christian life doesn't take place as a 'mountain top experience'. Go home and live faithfully as extraordinary Christians in ordinary situations."

He was right. Most of our Christian experience takes place in the everyday, regular, ordinary life where we live and work. Most services are not experiences where the earth quakes and the whole congregation lie prostrate in the power of the Spirit. The ordinary is just so... ordinary! Sometimes even, boring.

But read the Gospels. It was in the ordinary, everyday humdrum working out of life that the greatest miracles took place: a wedding; a funeral; a synagogue service; a walk along the road; a simple boat trip. If we are open to God, we will discover the beauty of the ordinary, and that we can be extraordinary servants in the most ordinary of situations.
