How often have you put something off which should have been done "now"? The old saying "procrastination is the thief of time" is just as true today as it was when first uttered. Doing the chores, revising, telling that difficult person to 'go away', difficult, dangerous or unpleasant things get parked on the back burner until a more appropriate time. Late September or early October sees the celebration of one of the three big Jewish festivals each year. Passover (Pesach in Hebrew) is in the spring; Pentecost (or Shavuot) occurs in early summer, but the autumn sees the harvest festival of the Feast of Tabernacle, or Sukkot.

Sukkot has a double significance. The one mentioned in the Book of Exodus is agricultural in nature—"Feast of Ingathering at the year's end" (Exodus 34:22)—and marks the end of the harvest time and thus of the agricultural year in the Land of Israel. The more elaborate religious significance from Book of Leviticus that of the is commemorating Exodus and the the dependence of the People of Israel on the will of God (Leviticus 23:42-43).

However, the main reminder of both interpretations of Sukkot is that it is God who provides, and we need to entirely put our trust in him - for both our freedom and our food. As we celebrate Harvest this month, we too remember the freedom and the provision that has been given to us as God's people in Jesus Christ.
